About this study guide

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001 appraising *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

assessing the value or quality of something

The expert spent hours **appraising** the antique furniture collection, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An appraiser studies an object beside a price scale; appraising means judging value or quality.

002 conceptualize *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to form an idea or concept in the mind

It was difficult to **conceptualize** such an abstract theory, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Conceptualize by drawing a blueprint inside a thought bubble before anything exists physically.

003 discern *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to perceive or recognize something with difficulty or effort

It was difficult to **discern** the truth from all the conflicting reports, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Use a magnifying glass in fog to discern the faint shape with effort.

004 discernible *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

able to be perceived, recognized, or distinguished

There was no **discernible** difference between the two products, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: A faint outline becomes discernible when it can finally be recognized through the fog.

ALSO · ADJECTIVE: able to be seen or recognized

005 distracted *verb/adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

unable to concentrate due to being preoccupied; diverted from attention

The **distracted** driver failed to notice the red traffic light, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Five flashing alerts pull the mind away from its task and leave it distracted.

006 distraction *noun*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

something that diverts attention; a state of being distracted

Social media can be a major **distraction** when trying to study, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: A loud notification dragging eyes from a book is a distraction.

007 **evaluate** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to assess or judge the value, quality, or importance of

The committee will **evaluate** all proposals before making a decision, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Evaluate by placing quality, value, and importance on a judgment scale.

008 **evaluated** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

assessed or judged the value, quality, or importance of

The candidates were **evaluated** based on their skills and experience, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: The item was evaluated after its value and quality were weighed on a scale.

009 **exposure** *noun*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

the state of being exposed to something; experience or contact with

Limited **exposure** to sunlight can lead to vitamin D deficiency, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Exposure places something outside its shield and in contact with the surrounding force.

010 **hearing** *noun*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

the faculty of perceiving sounds; a legal proceeding where evidence is presented

The court scheduled a **hearing** to review the new evidence, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: An ear receives sound; a courtroom hearing receives evidence.

011 **identified** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

established or recognized the identity of something

The detective **identified** the suspect from the security footage, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: A matching name tag shows that the object's identity has been identified.

012 **ignore** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to refuse to take notice of or acknowledge; to disregard intentionally

You should never **ignore** the warning signs of a serious illness, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Turn your eyes and ears away from the ringing bell to ignore it intentionally.

013 **ignores** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

refuses to take notice of; disregards

He **ignores** all criticism and continues with his controversial approach, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Someone who ignores a signal deliberately gives it no attention.

014 **imaginable** *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

possible to imagine or conceive

They tried every solution **imaginable** before finding the right one, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: If the mind can place it inside a thought bubble, it is imaginable.

015 **imaginary** *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

existing only in the imagination; not real

As a child, she had an **imaginary** friend named Sparkle, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: An imaginary castle lives only inside a thought bubble, not in the real world.

016 **imagine** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to form a mental image or concept of something not present

Can you **imagine** what life was like before electricity, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Imagine by projecting a mental picture of something that is not present.

017 **imperceptible** *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

so slight or subtle as to be difficult to detect or perceive

The changes were so **imperceptible** that no one noticed them at first, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: An imperceptible mark is so faint that even a magnifying glass barely detects it.

ALSO · ADJECTIVE: so slight as to be impossible to perceive

018 **insensible** *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

unconscious or unaware; lacking sensitivity

He was **insensible** to the cold after spending hours in the snow, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An insensible person lies unconscious while sights, sounds, and touches pass unnoticed.

ALSO · ADJECTIVE: unaware of or indifferent to

019 **inspect** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to look at something closely to assess its condition or quality

The mechanic will **inspect** the car before approving it for sale, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Inspect a surface with a magnifying glass to judge its condition and quality.

020 **inspecting** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

examining something closely to assess its condition

The detective was **inspecting** the crime scene for clues, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Inspecting means moving a magnifying glass slowly over every detail.

021 **interpret** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to explain the meaning of something; to understand in a particular way

Scholars continue to **interpret** the ancient text in different ways, shaping how the audience **interpreted** the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Interpret a coded message by unlocking the meaning you understand it to contain.

022 **interpretation** *noun*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

an explanation or understanding of the meaning of something

Her **interpretation** of the poem was both unique and insightful, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An interpretation is one reader's labeled key to the meaning of a message.

023 **judges** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

forms an opinion about something; presides over legal proceedings

The panel **judges** contestants based on creativity and skill, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A judge weighs evidence on a scale to form an opinion or legal ruling.

024 **misconstrue** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to interpret something incorrectly; to misunderstand the meaning

Please don't **misconstrue** my silence as agreement with your proposal, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A sign read through a WRONG lens is misconstrued and given an incorrect meaning.

025 mystifying *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

utterly bewildering or perplexing

The magician's **mystifying** illusions left the audience speechless, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: A mystifying puzzle hides every answer behind layers of question marks.

026 observable *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

able to be noticed or perceived

The effects of the medication were **observable** within a few hours, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: If an eye can notice the signal, the signal is observable.

027 observant *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

quick to notice things; watchful and attentive

An **observant** detective noticed the small clue that solved the case, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An observant detective notices the tiny clue everyone else misses.

028 overlook *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to fail to notice or consider something; to have a view from above

It's easy to **overlook** small details when you're in a hurry, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: From a tower you overlook the town; in a rushed list you may overlook a detail.

029 overlooked *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

failed to notice or consider; ignored

The talented artist was **overlooked** for the prestigious award, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: The tiny unchecked detail was overlooked while attention passed above it.

030 perceive *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to become aware of something through the senses or mind

Different cultures may **perceive** the same gesture differently, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Perceive by letting the senses or mind switch on an awareness light.

031 **presume** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to suppose something is true without proof; to take for granted

I **presume** you have already read the report, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Presume by placing a TRUE stamp on an idea before proof has arrived.

032 **presuppose** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to require as a precondition; to assume beforehand

The argument seems to **presuppose** that everyone has equal access, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: A presupposition is an assumption installed as a foundation before the argument begins.

033 **recognition** *noun*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

acknowledgment of something's existence, validity, or legality; identification of someone or something

She received **recognition** for her contributions to the field, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Recognition joins a familiar face to its name and places an acknowledgment stamp beside it.

034 **recognizable** *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

able to be recognized or identified from previous encounters or knowledge

The logo is instantly **recognizable** around the world, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: A recognizable face immediately connects to a stored name from an earlier encounter.

035 **recognize** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to identify someone or something from having encountered them before; to acknowledge the existence or validity of

I didn't **recognize** her with her new haircut, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Recognize a familiar face by matching it to memory, or recognize a fact with an acknowledgment stamp.

036 **recognized** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

identified from previous encounters; acknowledged as valid or important

He is **recognized** as one of the leading experts in his field, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: The face matched memory and the claim received approval; both were recognized.

037 **reflect** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to throw back light, heat, or sound; to think deeply or carefully about something

Take some time to **reflect** on what you want to achieve, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A mirror reflects light; a quiet mind mirrors an idea while thinking deeply.

038 **reviewed** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

examined or assessed something formally; wrote a critical evaluation

The committee **reviewed** all applications carefully, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A reviewed work has passed under a formal magnifying glass and critical pen.

039 **scrutinized** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

examined or inspected closely and thoroughly

The accountant **scrutinized** every expense report for errors, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: The object was scrutinized beneath a magnifying glass that checked every detail.

040 **trace** *noun/verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to find or discover by investigation; a mark or line left by something

Detectives were able to **trace** the phone call to a nearby location, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Trace a trail by following the faint marks back to their source.

041 **traced** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

followed or discovered the course or origin of something

She **traced** her ancestry back five generations to Ireland, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Investigators traced the line backward until they discovered its course and origin.

042 **underestimate** *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to estimate something to be smaller or less important than it actually is

Never **underestimate** the power of persistence and hard work, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Underestimate by placing the estimate bar below the object's true value.

043 underestimated *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

judged to be smaller or less significant than the actual value or extent

The challenger was **underestimated** by her opponents and won decisively, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: The small estimate fell below the much larger actual value; it was underestimated.

044 underestimating *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

in the process of estimating something as less than its true value

By **underestimating** the project's complexity, they failed to meet the deadline, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: Underestimating means drawing a value line lower than reality deserves.

045 understandable *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

able to be understood; reasonable or expected under the circumstances

Her frustration with the delayed flight was completely **understandable**, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: An understandable explanation switches on a clear light in the mind.

046 watched *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

looked at or observed attentively over a period of time

She **watched** the sunset from the balcony until the last light faded, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An open eye followed the subject attentively over time; it watched.

047 construe *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to interpret or understand in a particular way

His silence was **construed** as agreement, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Construal is the meaning-lens through which a person interprets a message.

048 astute *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

having sharp judgment and keen perception

The **astute** investor predicted the market crash, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: An astute observer spots the crucial clue and makes a sharp judgment.

049 perspicacious *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

having a ready insight into things; mentally sharp

Her **perspicacious** analysis impressed the board members, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Perspicacious eyes look through complexity and immediately see the key insight.

052 sagacious *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

having acute mental discernment and wisdom

The **sagacious** elder offered invaluable advice, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A sagacious guide combines sharp discernment with a well-worn book of wisdom.

050 perceptive *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

having keen insight or understanding

The **perceptive** teacher noticed the student's hidden anxiety, helping the observers form a more accurate understanding of the underlying issue.

MEMORY CUE: A perceptive mind catches a subtle clue that less attentive eyes miss.

053 comprehend *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to understand fully

It took years to fully **comprehend** the implications of the discovery, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: Comprehend by fitting every piece of the idea into one complete mental picture.

051 discerning *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

having good judgment or taste

The **discerning** critic praised only the finest performances, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: A discerning judge separates the excellent choice from nearly identical alternatives.

054 fathom *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to understand after much thought

I cannot **fathom** why anyone would make such a decision, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Lower a thinking line into a deep idea until its meaning is fully fathomed.

055 decipher *verb*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

to succeed in understanding something difficult

Experts worked for years to **decipher** the ancient text, shaping how the audience interpreted the information that followed in the discussion.

MEMORY CUE: Decipher a locked code by turning its strange symbols into clear meaning.

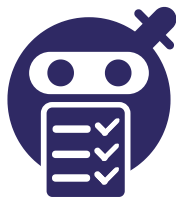
056 profound *adjective*

PERCEPTION & UNDERSTANDING

very deep or intense; showing great insight

The book offers **profound** insights into human nature, revealing how perspective influenced the conclusions people drew from the same evidence.

MEMORY CUE: A profound idea descends far below the surface into deep insight.
